• Diverse perspectives:





Let's not forget in the midst of the candy that February is also American Heart Month. Heart Health is important and it's important to care for your heart. Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the U.S.

Facts:

High blood pressure is a leading cause of heart disease.

- 1. High blood pressure is the risk for heart disease and stroke. Controlling blood pressure levels is essential.
- 2. Heart disease can lead to a financial issue. The cost of medications, health care services, lost wages from work amounted to \$252.2 billion between 2019 and 2020.
- 3. Obesity can lead to high blood pressure and diabetes which affects the heart
- 4. Risk factors: high blood pressure, high cholesterol, obesity, family history, your age, and smoking.

Acts of Love for your Heart

- 1. Exercise: Begin walking, chair exercises, just get moving!
- 2. Cooking and eating healthy meals
- 3. Getting quality sleep
- 4. Take your medications as prescribed
- 5. Quit smoking
- 6. Decrease alcohol intake
