



June is Men's Health Month. Yes, men it's all about you this month! Every day we appreciate all that you do for your family and community. June has been recognized as National Men's Health Awareness Month since 1992. The goal is to bring more awareness of preventable health problems and the importance of early screening/detection.

Prostate cancer is a health issue that is most common in men. Men tend to be more reluctant to go to the doctor for screening. The prostate exam consists of a digital rectal exam and a blood test (PSA). It is recommended that screening begin at the age of 50 for men. Men with a family history may need to be screened at an earlier age of 45. Remember, early detection and treatment leads to better outcomes. Talk with your physician to discuss your preventable plan.

Men, know your numbers. Schedule an annual medical exam which would include, blood pressure, weight, blood sugar, cholesterol, etc. Knowledge is power! Knowing your numbers aids you and your health care provider in guiding your health care to include diet, exercise, and medication if needed for overall health wellness. Decreasing stress factors also enhance wellness.

Women, encourage the men in your life (spouse, sons, grandfathers, grandsons, uncles, etc.) to get a physical exam. Let them know how important they are to you, and you want their best health so that they can live their best life. Thank you, men, for being the provider, supporter, encourager, and role model in our lives. Now make that appointment!

Key Characteristics of a Good Father

Leader: Fathers are expected to lead their families spiritually and in other areas of life, guiding them towards righteousness and fulfilling God's purpose.

Provider: Fathers have the responsibility to provide for the needs of their families, both materially and emotionally.

Loving: A good father loves his children unconditionally and demonstrates this love through words and actions.

Patient: Fathers need to be patient with their children, understanding their struggles and supporting their growth.
